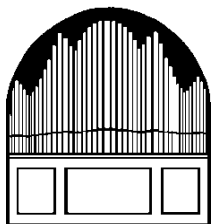

SPRECKELS ORGAN



Among the first of Balboa Park's cultural gems, thanks to the vision of brothers **Adolph and John D. Spreckels**, this gift to the people of San Diego is a pipe organ that can perform the full range of musical masterworks. Built by the Austin Organ Co. of Hartford, CT, the Spreckels Organ was deeded to the City on January 1, 1915 at the opening of the Panama-California Exposition and has played steadily ever since then. Today, it has a grand total of 4,518 pipes, comprising 73 ranks. The organ is maintained by L. W. Blackinton and Associates, Inc; Lyle Blackinton and Dale Sorenson, Co-Curators.

The **Spreckels Organ Society** was founded in 1988 as a non-profit corporation governed by an all-volunteer Board of Trustees. Presenting more than 62 concerts a year, the Society depends on your support to fulfill its mission, which is:

MEET TODAY'S ARTISTS



JARED JACOBSEN was the fifth in the unbroken chain of Civic Organists of the City of San Diego, playing weekly concerts on the Spreckels Organ from 1978 through 1985. (Dr. Carol Williams, our incumbent, is the seventh.) Currently he serves as Director of Music for First Lutheran Church in downtown San Diego and is a member of the performing arts faculty of the Bishop's School in La Jolla. During the summers he is Organist and Coordinator of Worship and Sacred Music for the historic Chautauqua

Institution in New York State, where he presides over the 107-year-old Massey Memorial Organ of four manuals and ninety-three ranks, located in the six-thousand-seat, open-air wooden Amphitheater which is the centerpiece of Chautauqua's programming.

LAUREN ABBOTT is a freshman at La Jolla High School. She has studied the piano for eight years, the flute for three years, and the organ for five months. She enjoys singing in her church choir and participating in her school's Latin club. Lauren loves playing outside with her dog, socializing with friends, and listening to music.

MIRANDA KAACK is eight years old and is in the third grade at St. Paul's Lutheran School in Pacific Beach. She lives with her parents, two sisters and a niece, and loves playing piano and organ. She also loves riding bikes with her dad, making crafts, and spending time with her family.

VINCENT PHAM is a freshman at Canyon Crest Academy, a public high school in the San Dieguito Union High School District. He is fourteen years old and enjoys accompanying and singing in his church choir. He has played the piano for ten years, the trumpet for two years, and the organ for four months. Vincent has studied taekwondo for four years and is a second-degree black belt.
