The failure to renew the City of San Diego's contract with Civic Organist Dr. Carol Williams does indeed jeopardize the free Sunday concerts, so the Spreeckels Organ Society is hard at work on a favorable resolution.

Since May, a team of Spreeckels Organ Society advocates has met with almost every council member or their staff representative, and it is expected that the issue will be on a meeting agenda later this summer. This experience has galvanized the SOS board and regional supporters, and spurred us to develop new ways of sharing the story of the Spreckels organ. SOS has also been inspired to think about new ways to program and promote concerts in the Pavilion. Your support and ideas are always welcome!

SOS to Present Scholarships at Christopher Houlihan Concert on August 1st

One of the tasks your Society takes most seriously is the nurture of young organists from our region. The San Diego community is blessed to have a team of gifted organ teachers who are committed to this nurture as well, and the

Society is proud of a rich collaboration we have developed over time with the San Diego Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, providing financial assistance through scholarships for worthy students each year.

On Saturday, May 14th, 18 organ students (and 9 piano students auditioning for an introductory set of organ lessons) took part in auditions on the recently enlarged instrument at First Unitarian Church in San Diego; Civic Organist Carol Williams and UCLA University Organist and professor Christoph Bull were among the judges who selected this year's SOS/AGO winners: Thomas Mellan (first place), Suzy Webster (second place), and Carl Best (third place). These remarkable young organists, along with five other young people who showed special merit, were invited by Dr. Williams to play the Spreckels Organ in a special concert entitled "The Young Organist" on Sunday, June 5th. three top winners will be presented with their scholarship checks at this summer's "Rising Star" program, which will feature the dazzling young organist Christopher Houlihan playing the Spreckels Organ on Monday, August 1st at 7:30 PM.

Thomas Mellan, 16, is a sophomore at Dehesa Charter High School in Escondido and also attends Palomar College in San Marcos. He has more than 30 compositions to his credit, including the nationally acclaimed Galaxies and Explosions. Thomas's organ music has been premiered at the Spreckels Organ Pavilion; St. Paul's Cathedral in San Diego; Rider University in New Jersey; and the historic Chautauqua Institution in New York, where former San Diego Civic Organist will present Galaxies and Explosions this summer on the historic Massey Memorial Outdoor Organ.

Suzy Webster, 12, will be entering the 7th grade at Santa Fe Christian Junior High School this fall, and has studied piano and organ with Leslie Wolf Robb since she was five. A recent first-place winner in the Southern California Bach Festival Regional and Complete Works Competitions, Suzy will perform in the Bach Festival Memorial Awards Program on October 15th, on the world's largest church organ at the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles.





Carl Best, 10, just finished his 4th grade year at Torrey Pines Elementary School. He also is a piano and organ student of Leslie Wolf Robb, and earned an Honorable Mention at the MTAC Sonata Contest in 2010 and Excellent ratings at the MTAC Certificate of Merit evaluation this year. Upon completion of his father's sabbatical year in San Diego, Carl and his family will travel home to Holland, Michigan, where Carl will return to the piano and organ studio of Judy Koeman.
