All six winners have been invited by our Civic Organist to perform on the Sunday afternoon concert on June 20th. A French-born pianist, organist, and composer, Thomas is fifteen years old and a freshman at Dehesa Charter School. He studies piano with Katalin Lukacs, organ with July Collier, improvisation with Christopher Cook, and composition with UCSD's Richard Snow. For the past two years he has been awarded mention as

an Emerging Composer at the New York Art Ensemble's young composer competition. He has studied martial arts for six years and "hopes to be organist of the Grand Orgue at Paris's Notre Dame Cathedral"

## **JEANINE WALTER (2nd place)**







## Snacks Operating System

SOS means something different in various places. An SOS call can mean HELP. For readers of the STOPTAB the initials, SOS stands for Spreckels Organ Society. SOS also stands for SNACKS OPERATING SYSTEM.

SNACKS OPERATING SYSTEM is that wonderful available service of snacks etc during the concerts of the Summer Organ Festival (SOF). Volunteers not only staff the tables, some bring the snacks. and prepare for serving attendees. This is one of the few places you can buy a Cup of Coffee for a Dollar.

The Snacks Operating System has been on site at the West entrance to the Pavilion for several years. Attendees expect to find the cookies, sandwiches, soft drinks and coffee -- coffee for a dollar! Some patrons are regulars and well known to the volunteer staff. One patron is partial to one kind of doughtnut that is offered. Knowing this patron well, the staff set one aside so the favored pastry is available.

Payment has been \$1.00 for all items making change rather convenient. However if a Sacagawea coin is offered for payment, confusion can happen. Considering the dim light and the size of the coin, that coin maybe mistaken for a quarter. Costs remain minimal with only slight increase in some items this season. The coffee at only \$1.00 remains a bargain.

A parade of volunteers over the years has made SOS the friendly place it is. Volunteers arrive early to assemble the area for customers; arrange items, fill coffee urns etc. The customers receive more than bags of cookies or peanuts;,they also receive friendly exchanges and courteous service. At the close of the concert, volunteers prepare all equipment for removal. Only volunteers and hours they dedicate make Snacks Operating System possible. Attendees can depend on this convenience - Coffee is still \$1.00.
