Members of the Spreckels Organ Society met for the annual meeting prior to the August 1st Summer Organ Festival Concert.

Updates on the City's contract with the Civic Organist, plans for the Plaza de Panama and Centennial, and organizational updates were offered along with a Volunteer of the Year award for photographer Bob Lang. Many of these same members came to the City Council chambers the following day to support the renewal of San Diego's contract with Dr. Carol Williams as Civic Organist, a dramatic story with a happy ending: the City Council voted unanimously to approve the contract for a ten-year term, preserving

the City's partnership commitment to programming great music on the Spreckels Organ. Membership interest in SOS is at a new high level thanks to this issue and also to new avenues of outreach such as You'Tube and Facebook. During this year's special membership promotion during Silent Movie Night, 46 people joined up!

Plaza De Panama Update

Take a Walking Tour of the Plaza de Panama Project

The Plaza de Panama Project is a plan proposed by Qualcomm founder Irwin Jacobs to restore the heart of Balboa Park for the 2015 Centennial Celebration. You can learn more about the Project by taking one of the free monthly walking tours led by members of the Plaza de Panama design team. The tours are held on the third Saturday of every month at 10:30 a.m., starting in front of the Museum of Man.


The Plaza de Panama Project proposes to remove all parking and traffic from the Plaza de Panama, Plaza de California, West El Prado and Esplanade, restoring these spaces to pedestrian use. The Project also includes a new underground parking structure behind the Organ Pavilion for about 800 cars. It would be be topped with additional park space, amounting to a total of 6 acres of new park space that is currently occupied by roads and surface parking.
